

Writing a support letter

1. Write to family and friends, even those not part of a church. My experience is that people are glad to know what you are doing to help others, especially when it is so different from the ordinary. Many are interested in helping in your journey and want to hear about it when you return.
2. Tell why you want to be part of this team.
3. Explain the scope of this team.
4. Explain the costs involved with this mission:
 - a. Your personal expense, which is \$2500 + immunizations, visa, etc.
 - b. Materials needed for the team projects.
